COMOMAG INSTRUCTION 5100.1G

Subj: COMMAND SAFETY AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH PROGRAM

1. Purpose. To provide information concerning command policy regarding explosive and industrial safety and the occupational health program within Commander, Mobile Mine Assembly Group (COMOMAG) and Mobile Mine Assembly Group (MOMAG).

2. Cancellation. COMOMAGINST 5100.1F. This instruction is a major revision and should be read in its entirety.

3. Discussion. Safety and occupational health are inherent responsibilities of everyone in this command. Safety and occupational health are fundamental elements in the operation of all facilities and equipment. References (a) through (f) contain both general and specific explosive and industrial safety precautions and occupational health standards that are applicable throughout COMOMAG and MOMAG. It is incumbent upon all command personnel to ensure an effective and aggressive safety and occupational health program is continually pursued. The ultimate goal of this program is to reduce occupational injuries, illnesses or deaths, and material losses or damages to the maximum extent possible.

4. Action

a. Commanding Officer (CO)/Officer-in-Charge (OIC). Each CO/OIC will ensure that a comprehensive, vigorous and viable safety program that embraces safety and occupational health is established and enforced at all levels of command.

b. Collateral Duty Safety Petty Officer. A collateral duty Safety Petty Officer will be assigned to enforce the requirements of this instruction. The collateral duty Safety Petty Officer will:

(1) Become familiar with references (a) through (f) and be responsible for the effective administration of the command safety program.

(2) Be thoroughly familiar with the safety and occupational health hazard reporting requirements.

(3) Take positive action to ensure all safety, occupational health standards and hazardous material controls are vigorously applied throughout the command.

(4) Conduct frequent safety inspections of all work spaces.

(5) Work closely with the host command's Safety Officer per established Interservice Support Agreement (ISSA).

c. Quality assurance personnel will act as safety observers and aid the enforcement of this policy.

5. Reporting. A vitally important function of the Safety Petty Officer is the submission of the reports required by references (e) and (f). He/she will ensure the required reports are submitted per established guidelines.
